 - 1.1. List five (05) disasters of hydro-meteorogical origin you would expect in different parts of the island in relation to the annual weather pattern of the country. (25 marks)
 - 1.2. Describe briefly the actions taken to prevent and mitigate the effects of floods in Sri Lanka. (25 marks)
 - 1.3. List five (05) health effects of droughts in Sri Lanka. (25 marks)
 - 1.4. Discuss the actions that can be taken to mitigate the health effects due to droughts. (25 marks)
- 2. A COVID-19 cluster has been identified in a locality following a mass gathering at a religious place in an area where you are the Medical Officer of Health (MOH) of the relevant area.
 - 2.1. Briefly describe the health response you implement to control this.

 - 2.2. List five (05) non-health organizations that you would get involved in your control activities. (10 marks)
 - 2.3. Discuss the role of Epidemiology Unit in the COVID-19 pandemic response in Sri Lanka. (30 marks)
 - 2.4. State the advantages and disadvantages of quarantining persons at their home vs at designated institutions in COVID-19 response in Sri Lanka.

There has been a mulitple vehicle high speed crash involving 21 vehicles on a Monday morning at 8.00 a.m. due to a luxury bus carrying foreigners going out of control in the Southern Expressway between Gelanigama and Dodangoda interchanges towards Colombo. There has been a storm with heavy rain at the time of the incident.
 - 3.1. List ten (10) aspects need to be addressed when responding to the above disaster. (30 marks)
 - 3.2. Describe briefly how the above aspects are addressed effectively.

- 4. An earthquake had occurred at Digana area and many people lost their homes. The plan is to house the displaced in a temporary camp. Digana Hospital is also damaged.

- 4.1. List the main steps in initiating basic health services at the onset of this humanitarian crisis on maternal and child care. (40 marks)
- 4.2. List five (05) possible reasons for needing urgent and special care for each of the following groups in the displaced community. (30 marks)
 - 4.2.1. Women
 - 4.2.2. Pregnant women
 - 4.2.3. Chidren
- 4.3. One section of the temporary camp had to be retained in the fourth week after the earthquake due to logistical reasons. Some inmates in this section have developed suicidal thoughts.
