3. How would you assess an impacted maxillary canine and predict prognosis.  
Discuss the important aspects in surgical exposure and bracket bonding for an impacted maxillary canine for a successful outcome.
4. A 75-year-old woman was admitted for a mandibular surgery, she is a known diabetic for the past 25 years and on oral hypoglycaemic drugs. Recently she was detected to have very high blood pressure and commenced on antihypertensive drugs. She is also a tobacco smoker from her young age. While in the ward, she developed shortness of breath.  
Discuss the possible clinical diagnoses and management of this patient.

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
