1. A 45 year old bus driver is seen in the outpatient clinic with features of major depression. He gives a history of consuming 2- 3 bottles of illicit alcohol, every day for the last 2 years. He is also using cannabis occasionally. His wife has brought him to the clinic after she found a suicide note written by the client where he was planning to drive his bus over a cliff. The client is ambivalent about his alcohol use.
 - 1.1. Outline the initial assessment of this client. (20 marks)
 - 1.2. Briefly describe the initial management of this client. (30 marks)
 - 1.3. Describe the long term management of this client. (30 marks)
 - 1.4. Outline the medico legal and ethical issues in the management of this client. (20 marks)

 - 2.1. Outline the aetiology of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) in children? (30 marks)
 - 2.2. Describe the common comorbidities of ADHD. (30 marks)
 - 2.3. You see a 16-year-old patient with ADHD who has been taking methylphenidate for the last 9 years. He wants to know if he will have to continue on his ADHD medication into adulthood. What would you tell him? (40 marks)

3. A GCE Advance Level (A/L) student comes to see you complaining of excessive worry about facing the examination. For the last few weeks she also has poor concentration, poor sleep, exaggerated startle response, urinary urgency and frequent bowel motions especially after meals. When she goes to the toilet she spends more than an hour.
 - 3.1. Explain the neurobiological and psychological basis of her symptoms. (35 marks)
 - 3.2. Describe her management if she presented six months before her examination with above symptoms. (35 marks)
 - 3.3. Describe her management if she presented six days before her examination with above symptoms. (30 marks)

 - 4.1. Compare the aetiology and clinical features of anorexia nervosa and bulimia nervosa. (40 marks)
 - 4.2. Describe the management of both conditions. (60 marks)
5. A remand prisoner who has seriously assaulted his wife is produced by the court to you to provide a report on his mental state. On questioning he reveals that his wife deserved to be dead as she was cheating him by having multiple sexual relationships with several neighbourhood men. He fails to give any reasonable evidence as proof of her infidelity, but says that his intuition says that she was unfaithful to him throughout the marriage. He has caused grievous bodily harm to her several times previously as she refused to confess about her unfaithfulness, and feels that it is his responsibility to get the truth from her.
 - 5.1. Outline the clinically relevant facts that you would elicit in the history of this accused to arrive at a diagnosis. (20 marks)
 - 5.2. List the psychiatric legal issues that need to be addressed in the report that you need to submit to the courts. (20 marks)
 - 5.3. Outline the relevant components in the assessment of his criminal responsibility. (30 marks)
 - 5.4. Describe the use of HCR-20 scale in predicting future violent offending in this accused? (30 marks)
6. Describe how you would formulate a post disaster mental health programme as a regional psychiatrist. (100 marks)
