Answer all three questions.

1. A 24-year-old primigravida with no previous history of significant illnesses, had a routine dating scan at 8 weeks. The scan showed a 6-7 cm adnexal mass in addition to a viable intrauterine pregnancy of 8 weeks. Justify and outline your management.
2. Critically evaluate the current antenatal care model in Sri Lanka.
3. Outline the management of pregnant mothers (including the newborn) during H1N1 Influenza (Swine Flu) pandemic.
4. Discuss the statement “Universal Immunization program with HPV vaccination would virtually eradicate all cases of cancer of the cervix in Sri Lanka”.
5. How would you advise a 30-year-old woman with polycystic kidneys who wishes to become pregnant for the first time. Routine blood tests demonstrate that she has serum creatinine of 175 $\mu\text{mol/L}$ (Normal reference range 70 – 110 $\mu\text{mol/L}$).
6. A 48 year old woman who had a total abdominal hysterectomy, complains of a watery discharge from the vagina on the 10th postoperative day. Discuss the principles of management of this patient.
