

### **Summary**

Mrs.E, 86 years old previously diagnosed patient with ischaemic heart disease and hypertension presented with features of mixed urinary incontinence predominating stress incontinence, pelvic organ prolapse for a few years and post-menopausal bleeding for 2-3 months. Her physical examination and investigations revealed cystourethrocele, utero-vaginal prolapse and focal ulceration of the cervix. Her endometrial tissue was normal. She had undergone vaginal hysterectomy and anterior repair, which relived most of her symptoms. Her vision and hearing impairment, osteoarthritis, risk of malnutrition, anaemia and environmental hazards needed to be addressed in order to improve her functional independence.
