Summary

A Sixty seven year old seemingly normal gentleman, developed gradual onset painless haematuria for more than four months with no associated constitutional symptoms or local or systemic metastasis.

Radiological evaluation revealed a renal cell carcinoma with no distant metastasis. Cytoreductive surgery was undertaken; histology revealed a Farman's grade II tumour.

Lack of multidisciplinary team approach, prior comprehensive geriatric assessment and unaddressed moderate depression were among the deficiencies identified in the management.
