

Summary

This 23 year old patient was referred from private sector with a positive Venereal Disease Laboratory Test (VDRL) titer of R₃₂ and Possitive Treponaema Pallidum Particle Agglutination (TPPA) report. He presented with a healing chancre for two months duration and scrotal rash resembling annular syphillide rash for 3 weeks. There was no history of itching, bleeding or pus discharge from the ulcer. He denied having similar lesion in anal region. There was no preceding history of trauma, taking any oral medication before noticing the ulcer. Patient denied having multiple ulcers with pain in the past.

He was diagnosed with secondary syphillis with positive serology and clinical manifestations. Treatment with a single dose of Benzathene Penicillin his symptoms settled within one month. His first follow up VDRL after one month was R₄. His second follow up VDRL was R₂.
