Summary

A pregnant mother of 29 years of age from Rikillagaskada, was referred to Kalubowila STD clinic by a Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist at Colombo South Teaching Hospital for further management of Trichomonas infection. By the time, she was at 37 weeks of period of amenorrhoea (POA). Even though the patient has experienced a scanty yellowish vaginal discharge during last two weeks, she has not sought medical advice as she has considered this as a normal phenomina in pregnancy. On examination, offensive greyish vaginal discharge was noted. Furthermore, features of strawberry cervix and a cervical growth at twelve o'clock position were observed. Trichomonas vaginalis infection was confirmed as it was detected in her wet vaginal smear and urine full report. She was treated by oral metronidazole 400mg twice-a-day for one-week duration. Her spouse was also found to be having Trichomonas vaginalis infection and he was also treated with metronidazole. Since both partners strongly denied any extra marital sexual relationships, further contact tracing was not possible.
