

Summary:

26 years' pregnant woman from Homagama presented to the clinic of National STD AIDS control programme due to her husband is having genital ulcer. She was a primi mother and her last regular menstrual date was uncertain. VOG opinion or early antenatal clinic registration was not done. She had two male sexual partners in her whole life and this was an unexpected pregnancy. She had single, painful, non-discharging ulcer and small blister in right inguinal fold just lateral to the labia majora for two days. This was her first experience and none of the complications were noted. She was diagnosed as giant cell positive genital herpes in second trimester and treated with oral acyclovir for seven days. She was fully recovered with treatment. Suppressive therapy at 36 weeks of POA was not given due to defaulted follow up. She delivered vaginally, in term and at the time of her delivery she was asymptomatic. The infant didn't show any features of neonatal herpes.

Her husband was diagnosed as Genital Herpes and treated with oral Acyclovir.
