## Summary

Mrs.C, a sixty-year-old mother of one, had menopause nine years back, and is a diagnosed patient with hypothyroidism for twelve years and hypercholesterolemia for ten years, presented with urinary incontinence for three years and lump at vulva for one year. She had associated low back pain, abdominal heaviness, constipation, and dyspareunia.

On examination, mild external genitalia atrophy was present with no visible masses and stress incontinence could be elicited. Barthel index was 95/100 but she had no other geriatric syndromes such as falls, polypharmacy, immobility, cognitive or sensory impairments.

She underwent investigations including trans-vaginal scan and was diagnosed to have stress predominant urinary incontinence with small rectocele and was treated with Trans-obturator repair with no post-operative complications and improvement of symptoms with Barthel index of 100/100 on follow-up.
