Summary

A 79 years old married gentleman, father of two daughters, who's diagnosed of uncomplicated diabetes mellitus for 4 years duration, who's on regular clinic follow up and good blood sugar control, presented with poor stream of urine and urge incontinence for 6 years duration associated with urge incontinence, hesitancy, terminal dribbling, nocturia, increased frequency and recurrent episodes of urinary tract infections. He denied hematuria, loss of weight, loss of appetite or back pain. On digital rectal examination there's an enlarged firm prostate. Ultrasound scan and uroflowmetry revealed severe prostatomegaly with reduced urine flow rate. Since he had severe prostatomegaly he underwent Trans Urethral Resection Of Prostate. Social embarrassment due to urinary incontinence, functional incapacity, psychological impact, risk of fall are the major challenges that were identified. He hadn't any postoperative complications. Following the surgery he has got rid of urinary symptoms and has marked improvement in functional capacity and psychological aspect.
