

Summary

A sixty-two-year-old male from Mathara with hypertension and dyslipidaemia presented with progressive lower urinary tract symptoms for 4 years duration. He was diagnosed with bladder outflow obstruction due to benign prostatic hyperplasia and underwent uncomplicated transurethral resection of the prostate gland(TURP).
