

Summary

Sixty eight years old diagnosed patient with knee and spine osteoarthritis presented four months back with lower urinary tract symptoms, loss of appetite and weight for one month duration. He was found to have bilateral hydronephrosis and pyelonephritis complicated with acute kidney injury; managed with broad spectrum intravenous antibiotics and haemodialysis. He is currently managed with a urinary catheter, alpha blockers and 5 α reductase inhibitors. He was found to have concomitant right ureteric stricture on ureteroscopy. He is awaiting nephrostogram for persisting right hydronephrosis and prostate specific antigen evaluation to exclude prostate carcinoma before definitive management for combined ureteric and bladder outflow obstruction due to suspected benign prostatic hyperplasia.
