

Abstract:

Polymyositis (PM) is an inflammatory myopathy of unknown etiology. Proximal skeletal muscle weakness and the evidence of muscle inflammation are hallmark of polymyositis. However, extramuscular manifestations may be prominent in some patients with inflammatory myopathy in addition to the primary pathology of the skeletal muscles^[4]. Interstitial lung disease is one of the common complications of polymyositis and dermatomyositis. However, overflow proteinuria is a rare manifestation in inflammatory myositis. In this case report we are presenting a rare case of a 65-year-old farmer admitted with bilateral leg swelling and difficult in walking, diagnosed as overflow proteinuria and lung fibrosis as a rare presentation of polymyositis.
