

Abstract

Paraneoplastic syndrome is a collection of signs and symptoms that occur due to remote effects which are not related to direct invasion, obstruction or metastases. Neurological, endocrine, dermatological, rheumatological, renal, haematological and ophthalmological paraneoplastic manifestations have been described in literature. The associated syndrome is generally dependent on the histological type of lung cancer. Usually neurological and dermatological paraneoplastic syndromes precede the diagnosis of the lung cancer. Here we report a patient who presented with several paraneoplastic manifestations associated with adenocarcinoma of the lung.
