

## **Abstract**

Motor neuron disease is a neurodegenerative disorder. The majority of the cases are sporadic. It is a chronic, progressive disorder that causes profound disability to the patient, currently with no definitive cure. It has a spectrum which includes progressive bulbar palsy, primary lateral sclerosis, progressive muscular atrophy and amyotrophic lateral sclerosis. This case describes a 42 year old patient, who presented with gradual onset left sided upper limb weakness, gait disturbance and bulbar involvement with a mixture of both upper and lower motor signs on examination. She was diagnosed to be having motor neuron disease according to clinical and neuro-electrophysiological criteria and supportive care was initiated. This case highlights the importance of having in mind the clinical suspicion of motor neuron disease and early diagnosis and initiation of supportive measures.
