

Abstract

Here in this case report we discuss a 30year old lady who presented with jaundice and generalized body swelling who subsequently developed altered level of consciousness. She had clinical features of thyrotoxicosis on systemic examination with a diffuse goiter. In thorough investigations, she had cholestatic jaundice and sub nephrotic range proteinuria which cannot be explained other than thyrotoxicosis. She had anaemia and thrombocytopenia with evidence of vitamin B12 deficiency and upper gastrointestinal endoscopy revealed pangastritis possibly secondary to pernicious anaemia. She improved with symptomatic treatment and treatment of hyperthyroidism. We could not start her on thianamides due to initial suspicion of chronic liver cell disease but she clinically responded to lugol's iodine and lithium therapy. She is currently awaiting radioactive ablation of the thyroid gland.
