Systemic Lupus Erythematosus (SLE) exhibits a diverse array of initially nonspecific symptoms, often causing delays in diagnosis and subsequently affecting patient prognosis. In this report, we present the case of a 58-year-old woman who sought medical attention for persistent oral erosions with hemorrhagic crusting and cheilitis, ultimately leading to a diagnosis of SLE. While cutaneous manifestations are frequently associated with SLE, this particular presentation is less commonly observed in clinical practice.
