Abstract

Sarcoidosis is a multisystem disorder of unknown etiology which is characterized by the formation of non-caseating granuloma. It commonly involves the lungs, lymphatics, and skin. Arthritic manifestations are also described in sarcoidosis and may mimic other rheumatological diseases as well. Association between sarcoidosis and rheumatological diseases also have been described in the literature. Here, we present a case of a patient who initially presented with joint involvement fulfilling the criteria for rheumatoid arthritis and had treatment for rheumatoid arthritis but was subsequently diagnosed as sarcoidosis with joint, lung, lymphatic, and skin involvement.
