

Abstract

In this report, we describe a patient with Limited Cutaneous Systemic Sclerosis (LcSSc) overlapping with Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA). The patient presented with progressive shortness of breath, fever, small joint pains in the bilateral hands, Raynaud's phenomenon, interstitial lung disease, and anemia, all without pulmonary hypertension. Positive rheumatoid factor, high ESR, and CRP levels were observed. A skin biopsy confirmed the diagnosis of LcSSc. The patient exhibited a good response to IV cyclophosphamide and other supportive care.
