Abstract

We present the case of a 70-year-old non-smoking female patient with a history of diabetes mellitus, who presented with progressive dyspnea on exertion. Despite the absence of significant pulmonary disease history and non-smoking status, her clinical examination and diagnostic workup revealed the presence of Combined Pulmonary Fibrosis and Emphysema (CPFE). This case highlights the occurrence of CPFE in a non-smoking female, emphasizing the diagnostic challenges and management considerations in such cases.
