

Abstract

Cocaine is a recreational substance that is showing rising trend of consumption and abuse, especially among teenagers and young adults both in Sri Lanka and rest of the world. 70% of cocaine is adulterated with Levamisole which has antihelminthic function and is known to be responsible for causing ANCA-associated necrotizing vasculitis. ^[1,2] Here we report a case of cocaine-levamisole associated vasculitis with multiple cerebral heamorrhages in a 38-year-old previously unscreened Sri Lankan patient.
