Abstract

Systemic onset juvenile idiopathic arthritis (SoJIA) or Still's disease is a systemic inflammatory disease of unknown aetiology. It includes all forms of idiopathic arthritis lasting for 6 weeks or more and onset before 16 years of age. It can present as a pyrexia of unknown origin (PUO). Because the lack of pathognomonic features, SoJIA is diagnosed by exclusion. Here we discuss about a young male who presented to us with prolonged fever and arthritis. He was finally diagnosed as SoJIA.
