

Abstract

Extra nodal lymphomas can occur anywhere outside the lymph node region such as primary lymphoid organs (e.g. spleen, thymus, waldeyer ring), organs or tissues devoid of lymphoid tissue (e.g. brain, soft tissue) and organs with a lymphoid tissue component (e.g. gastrointestinal tract). Gastrointestinal lymphomas may occur in any portion of the gastrointestinal tract. It can be primary or secondary lymphoma. Primary gastrointestinal lymphoma is almost always non-Hodgkin lymphoma. This case history describes a patient who presented with a primary gut lymphoma.
