Abstract

Sjogren's syndrome is a rheumatological disorder, which is uncommon in our country due to lack of symptoms in the initial stage. Recurrent hypokalemic paralysis was the presenting complains of this case report which has made the diagnosis of hypokalemic periodic paralysis previously. Lack of common presenting symptoms and unwariness of present symptoms by the patients, was the reason to persist undiagnosed for long period. This patient had few symptoms which were come out when deep questioning. But she was attributed them to some myth conception. Dry eyes and dry mouth have been with the patient for more than five years, which were slowly progressed. When she presented to our ward, she had significantly reduced tearing and salivation. As similarly, qudri-parasis was the presenting symptom of this time with significantly reduced potassium level. So our task was to find out the cause for hypokalemia as well as the few symptoms suggestive of Sjogren's syndrome (SS).
