

Abstract

Pseudomyxoma peritonei (PMP) is a mucinous neoplasm of the abdomen called jelly belly. It is a rare disease and manifests as different signs and symptoms. We report a case of a 65 year old female diagnosed as PMP, presented with rectal bleeding and differential ascites. Radiological and histological assessments play a major role in the diagnosis of PMP. There are many therapeutic modalities available for this condition. Rectal bleeding is the clinical feature of advanced disease and is a rare cause of PMP which carries high mortality.
