

## **Abstract**

In this case report we are discussing a 25year old vegan, presented with rapidly deteriorating level of consciousness and seizures with evidence of meningism who needed elective intubation and ventilation. On examination he had left sided upper motor type upper and lower limb weakness with positive Kernig's sign. His investigations revealed, bilateral thalamic haemorrhagic infarctions with thrombosis of the straight sinus and posterior part of superior sagittal sinus and R/S transverse sinus and obstructive hydrocephalus. There was evidence of pyogenic meningitis in cerebrospinal fluid. On further evaluation, there were macrocytic red cells with hyper segmented neutrophils and biochemical evidence of severe vitamin B12 and folate deficiency with transient hyperhomocysteinemia. His other thrombophilic screening was negative. He was successfully managed with extra ventricular drainage for his obstructive hydrocephalus and difficult anticoagulation done in the presence of haemorrhage with thrombosis. Patient fully recovered with full functional capacity.
