## Abstract

Yellow nail syndrome is a rare syndrome characterized by the triad of yellow nails, lymphoedema and pleural effusions. Here we report a case of a 62-year-old female presenting with chronic cough and shortness of breath for 2 years, with slow growing thickened yellow nails and lymphoedema of bilateral lower limbs, who was found to have bronchiectasis and a small left sided pleural effusion in the chest X-ray, diagnosed to have yellow nail syndrome. She was started on oral Vitamin E and Itraconazole and the nail changes partially responded to the treatment.
