

Abstract

Burkitt lymphoma (BL) is considered as an aggressive form of Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma (NHL) with B cell origin. The disease is one of the fastest growing human tumor with variable clinical manifestations due to extra nodal involvement. When a young patient presenting with a prolonged febrile illness accompanying poly-arthritis, non-malignant conditions are usually considered with priority. But it is important to consider serious conditions like BL at beginning as delayed diagnosis would result in devastating outcome.

Here, I am presenting a case of metastatic lymphoma in a young male presented with prolonged fever, poly-arthritis, episodic hard stools and subsequently developed bilateral proptosis and cranial neuropathies, which leads to increase awareness of this serious condition among medical teams so, to arrive early diagnosis of BL as it will have therapeutic implications.
