

## **Abstract**

Toxic epidermal necrolysis (TEN) is a very severe mucocutaneous reaction characterized by epidermal necrosis and denudation<sup>(4,9)</sup> Genitourinary involvement can occur in up to two-thirds of patients with TEN and hematuria is very rarely reported as a consequence of urinary tract involvement<sup>(1)</sup> In this case report we describe a patient presented with severe mucocutaneous eruption following ingestion of co amoxiclavate and mefenamic acid. Later she developed gross hematuria. She was treated with intravenous immunoglobulin and supportive measures and improved completely
