Abstract

Post-transplant lymphoproliferative disorder (PTLD) is a well-known complication of immunosuppressive therapy which is necessary to prevent transplant rejection following solid organ transplants. Clinical presentation of PTLD is highly variable and it is depending at upon the type of PTLD and the areas of involvement. B Symptoms such as fever, weight loss, and fatigue are common. Other symptoms may be related to, lymphadenopathy, dysfunction of involved organs, or due to external compression. PTLD usually involving organs such as gastrointestinal tract, lungs, skin, liver, central nervous system, and the allograft itself. Here we report a case of small bowel lymphoma presented as a small bowel obstruction in a 37-year-old female who undergone a kidney transplant.
