

Right atrial myxoma presenting as recurrent syncopal attacks in a patient who underwent surgical ASD closure.

Abstract

Myxomas are the most prevalent tumours among the rare primary cardiac tumours. Myxomas on right side is unusual site of localization. Its clinical presentation varies depending on their size and location. This is a rare case of massive right atrial myxoma obstructing tricuspid valve presented with recurrent syncopal attacks and exertional dyspnoea in a patient with the background past history of surgical closure of atrial septal defect (ASD) and underwent successful resection of atrial myxoma.
